Save The Bay's Notable History of Success

1961

Grassroots action **ORGANIZATION FOUNDED** by three courageous women

1969

Won state law creating permanent BAY CONSERVATION AND DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE to protect the Bay and create public access

1992

PASSED CENTRAL VALLEY PROJECT IMPROVEMENT ACT to keep more water in Bay rivers

2002

STOPPED SFO PLAN to fill Two square miles of Bay for runways

2008

Established new SF BAY RESTORATION AUTHORITY to raise public funding for marsh restoration

2010

SECURED SAN JOSÉ ORDINANCE banning single use plastic bags—then won bans covering 85% OF BAY AREA

2016

ESTABLISHED BAY DAY as a regional holiday to celebrate and support San Francisco Bay

2018

LAUNCHED "BAY SMART COMMUNITIES for a Sustainable Future," advocating clean water, transit, and housing equity priorities for Bay Area growth

2022

Passed the SAN FRANCISCO BAY RESTORATION. ACT After 12 years of diligent advocacy, providing \$54.5M annually for the Bay's health

1965

Won state moratorium halting Bay filling and study commission to CREATE BAY PLAN

- 1982

Stopped state from building Peripheral Canal to DIVERT FRESH WATER FROM BAY DELTA

- 1998

Launched on-the-bay student EDUCATION PROGRAM

2004

Created COMMUNITY-BASED RESTORATION PROGRAM to restore marsh habitat; built first native plant nursery

2009

Won first-ever **POLLUTION REGULATIONS** requiring zero trash in storm water entering the Bay by 2022

2012

STOPPED CARGILL PROJECT to build 12,000 homes on Redwood City salt ponds

2016

Passed Measure AA, a nine-county parcel tax RAISING \$500M FOR BAY RESTORATION

2019

WON ENFORCEMENT ORDER on Caltrans to clean up trash flowing from state roads to the Bay

Horizontal levees, like the one Jessie Olson and her team at Save The Bay are creating in Menlo Park, offer significant ecological benefits. This multi-year project involving volunteers and colleagues from Save The Bay features hundreds of plants that clean bay waters and provide crucial habitats.

Save The Bay helped to complete a 300-acre tidal marsh restoration that will help cities in the South Bay adapt to sea level rise. Salt marshes hold water during high tide and flood events and release it slowly, reducing flood risk to adjacent communities.

Save The Bay's advocacy with Bay Area legislators won placement of a \$10B climate resiliency bond on the statewide ballot this November. Californians will vote on the measure to fund projects that protect against rising tides, drought, and wildfires.

Relevant Connections: Personal and professional connections and industry networks that can be leveraged to benefit the organization. Community ties to Save The Bay program and issue locations are particularly valuable, such as those vulnerable to sea level rise and other climate change impacts.

Strategic Leadership: Demonstrated ability to help an organization stay true to its mission and values while adapting to changing environmental and social landscapes.

Fundraising Enthusiasm: A genuine interest in fundraising efforts and willingness to make Save The Bay a top personal philanthropic priority.

Advocacy: Policy and government experience and connections, and knowledge of government advocacy processes to help drive mission impact.

Commitment to Inclusion and Belonging: Dedication to advancing Diversity, Equity, Inclusion, and Belonging.

Board Engagement: Active board participation and a commitment to contributing to the board's growth, development, and positive culture. This includes commitment of time and thoughtful engagement to advance the mission, a positive, collegial approach, as well as collaboration with board members, staff, and key constituents.

As a board member of Save The Bay, your dedication and active participation are essential to the organization's success. Board members must support Save The Bay's mission, embrace its values, engage in fundraising efforts, promote Save The Bay within your networks, and contribute to strategic planning. By upholding the highest standards, you help ensure that Save The Bay remains a leader in environmental advocacy, restoration, and education.

Save The Bay expects all board members to regularly participate in board socials, public events, fundraising events, and volunteer opportunities to build community and support Save The Bay's mission. See page 9 for more ways to get involved.

Selected board members will begin their term in January 2025.

Leadership, Oversight, and Governance Responsibilities

- Hire, supervise, evaluate, and advise the Executive Director in managing the organization and implementing Save The Bay's strategic plan.
- Approve annual budgets, audit finances, and approve other business, fiduciary, and legal decisions.
- Prepare for, attend, and participate in board meetings, including reviewing agendas and supporting materials before each meeting.
- Represent Save The Bay as an active and enthusiastic ambassador, promoting the importance of the organization's work to the Bay and Bay Area communities.
- Assist in recruiting prospective board members and new constituents.
- Take on additional assignments as needed to support the organization.

Commitments

- Serve a three-year term with eligibility for re-appointment.
- Attend at least three of four quarterly board meetings in person each year.
- Participate in at least one standing committee and attend at least three of four virtual committee meetings each year.
- Attend at least 50% of Save The Bay's fundraising and cultivation events.
- Attend at least one volunteer restoration event each year.

Contributions

All board members will work collaboratively to set and meet annual fundraising goals, contributing to Save The Bay in various ways at a level to which they are comfortable. Save The Bay should be a top personal philanthropic priority for all board members during their term of service. Other ways to contribute include identifying new donors within your networks, supporting the establishment of new partnerships and community access, and supporting events. Save The Bay is open to suggestions for other equitable giving models.
